## Pastor's Message

Dear First Baptist Family, It is hard to believe that the month of May marks 6 months since our family moved to Sparta. 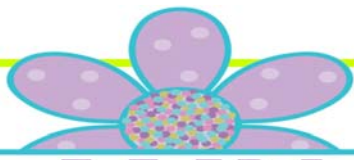

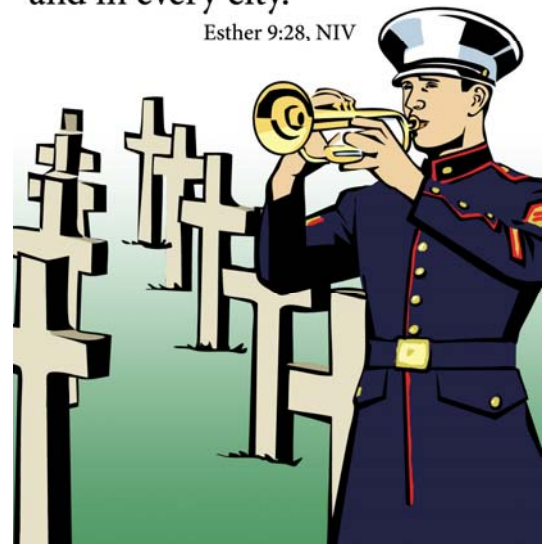

Under Old Business, Warren Taylor updated the group on the steps and hand railing. Donald Reeves is ready to lay the brick on the steps as soon as they get here and the weather cooperates. The railings are completed.

Pastor Matt gave an update on Wednesday Night Dinner to start in the month of May. He plans to use this as a test to see if the proposed program works. Donations will be accepted to cover the cost of the meals which during the test will be provided by The Patio. Jim Cox advised that

Baptist Men's Day will be the last Sunday of March. Easter Sunday will also be Brotherhood breakfast prepared by the Brotherhood.

JD Brooks gave the Financial Report for the month. A motion made to accept as given and seconded, all approved Deacon Family Ministries were reviewed and updated. A prayer was given by JD Brooks.

Pastoral Comments: Pastor Matt presented the deacons with 3 different phrases that best describe the church's

purpose statement. The deacons adopted the 3 G's statement, (Glorify, Grow, Go). Then the deacons were presented a Missionary Partnership Proposal which is a way the church can participate in the great commission through praying, giving and going. Becoming more involved with the church and individual missionaries through small groups developed in the church for Glorifying Growing together. Chairman Brett closed the meeting with prayer

## Deacon's Minutes: February, 2022

Chairman Jarrett greeted everyone and opened with prayer.

February 7th minutes were given time for review. A motion was made to accept as written and seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.

A Devotion was presented by Mike Rowe. Next month's devotion to be given by Bill Nilo.

Under New Business, a discussion of church growth was held. It was agreed that as the church continues to grow that a facility plan needs to be in place to make certain we meet the needs of the church. As part of that discussion, it was agreed that we need to maintain the existing facility and updating throughout the church is needed. It was discussed that the church needs to maintain a list of items needing attention and address them as time goes on. Brett discussed the idea of putting together a program to identify those needs possibly calling it "Build 2023" wherein the church and its members identify the needed improvements/repairs of the church thus creating a list to work off.

Building and Grounds is currently looking into estimates on painting the stairwell, the hallways, the fellowship hall and those



classrooms that have yet to be repainted. In addition, they are working on getting an estimate for new chairs for the choir loft and to replace the mortar between

the bricks on the outside of the church. It was noted that we have enough left-over plank flooring to do one of the smaller classrooms on the third floor.

As we look into the future, it was agreed that the church needed to re-engage a Long-Range Planning Committee to look at how the church could possibly expand. There is no immediate plan to do such, but the church needs to start the planning process. It was agreed that as part of the Ministry Fair that a Long-Range Planning Committee consisting of 12 members would be offered for participation.

Update on the bank behind the church was given by Brett. Bourne Landscaping have replaced the mulch with large rock to keep the bank from washing and to eliminate the need to mulch each year.

Pastor Matt updated the group on the Good Friday services to be held on April 15th. The Cross Walk will commence at Sparta Elementary School at 5:30

pm and the services at the church will begin a 6:00pm Discussion was held concerning use of the Fellowship Hall and the need for a cleaning deposit. It was agreed that the existing policy would be reviewed at the next meeting. This was brought up since the custodian was being required to cleanup after events held by members/nonmembers and should be compensated for his additional time.

Embrace has set a quota of 250 boxes for Operation Christmas Child. The cost of shipping the boxes is 9.00/box which would run \$2,250.00. Embrace offered to give \$500.00 to help in shipping and requested that the church help with the remaining shipping cost. The deacons discussed the best option and agreed that it would be to amend the budget to cover the total \$2250.00. It was agreed that the church would cover the cost of those boxes that didn't have the \$9.00 included in the box up to the \$2,250. A motion to approve was made to send to the Stewardship Committee for consideration and seconded, the vote was approved unanimously.
